



Resource Guide Energy, Water and Waste Management for the Hospitality Industry

INTRODUCTION

This resource guide is primarily concerned with the management of energy, water and waste in hospitality establishments. With growing concern for the environment, and an increase in legislation and costs, an understanding of best practice in environmental management is gaining more importance for hospitality managers. The guide provides an outline of various texts, journal articles, periodicals, websites and other sources of information regarding the key issues of:

- Global concerns related to the environment.
- Government policy, targets and legislation and their impacts on business operations.
- The importance of energy, water and waste management in hospitality.
- The management of energy, water and waste in hospitality.
- Assistance available (government and industry).

TEACHING ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT IN HOSPITALITY PROGRAMMES

Environmental Management in Hospitality may be taught as a complete module, or (as at the University of Plymouth), as a component of a module in Facilities Management. There are very few text books available that relate specifically to environmental management in the hospitality industry. However, modules may be supported by a number of Government and industry publications, along with the key texts of Kirk (1996) and Webster (1999).

A module in Environmental Management in Hospitality may be structured around the key issues cited in the introduction, and may include the following:

Global concerns related to the environment

- Climate change and global warming
- Ozone depletion
- Demand for resources outstripping supply
- Pollution
- Landfill impacts
- Acid rain

Government policy, targets and legislation and their impacts on business operations

- The Climate Change Bill (currently in draft version)

The importance of energy, water and waste management in hospitality

Based around Kirk's (1996) driving forces for change:

- Legislative and fiscal requirements
- Advantages resulting from financial savings
- Consumer attitudes
- Public opinion
- Enlightened management

The management of energy, water and waste in hospitality

- Environmental Management Systems and Standards, including ISO 14000 / ISO 14001
- Environmental Policies, Action Plans and Audits
- Towel re-use schemes
- Energy and water saving products and methods
- The hierarchy of waste (Kirk, 1996) and waste management

Assistance available (government and industry)

- Hospitable Climates and other advisory services
- Funding

SUGGESTED RESEARCH PROJECTS AND ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS

Research projects may be based upon any of the following:

- An examination of motivations for, and benefits of, compliance to best practice in environmental management in the hospitality industry.
- The degree to which hotels or restaurants in the UK conform to best practice in environmental management.
- The costs and benefits of going green in the hotel industry.

Students may be split into groups and assessed on a poster presentation and report on their choice of the following topics:

- Topic 1: Energy management in hotels
Topic 2: Water management in hotels
Topic 3: Waste management in hotels
Topic 4: Environmental management and cruise ships
Topic 5: An investigation into the environmental management practices of hospitality companies
Topic 6: Eco-tourism and sustainable tourism
Topic 7: Research in environmental management in the hospitality industry

Or, individuals may be assessed on an analysis and evaluation of a research paper in environmental management in the hospitality industry.

ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY

Unfortunately, there are very few textbooks available that specifically relate to the hospitality industry. However, the following texts are useful:

Barrow, C. J. (2006) *Environmental Management for Sustainable Development*. Routledge

This book details the role of environmental management in sustainable development. Part I discusses the theory, principles and key concepts of environmental management, Part II looks at practical application (including methods and tools, pollution and waste management and tourism and environmental management), while Part III focuses on 'the way ahead' (the future). The introduction includes a useful table of definitions of environmental management.

Esty, D. C. & Winston, A. S. (2006) *Green to Gold: How Smart Companies Use Environmental Strategy to Innovate, Create Value and Build Competitive Advantage*. Yale University Press

Described by the Financial Times as 'a manual on how to turn your company into an eco-success', this textbook provides discussion on issues relating to pollution and natural resource management, and the growing interest in sustainability. It includes practical suggestions for achieving and capitalising on achieving environmental success.

Harvard Business Review (2007) *Harvard Business Review Green Business Strategy*. Harvard Business School Press

Part of a series of books aimed at managers, this contains a number of Harvard Business Review articles which highlight the need for businesses to incorporate socially responsible strategies.

Kirk, D. (1996) *Environmental Management for Hotels. A Student's Handbook*. Oxford, Butterworth-Heinemann

Although relatively old, this text is still very relevant, and often cited by other authors. Based specifically upon environmental management in hotels, it is an ideal source of information for hospitality lecturers, students and industry managers. The book includes discussion of the driving forces for change, case material, and the practical implications of management in the key areas of water, energy, the indoor environment and waste.

Seneviratne, M. (2007) *A Practical Approach to Water Conservation for Commercial and Industrial Facilities*. Elsevier Science

This is an informative text based upon best practice in water management for both commercial and industrial facilities. Although not specifically aimed at the hospitality industry, the book does contain a chapter on the sector, which includes the following sections:

- Introduction
- Benchmarking Water and Energy Consumption
- Steps to Achieve Water Savings
- Staff Awareness Programmes
- Guest Awareness Programmes

Townsend, A. K. (2007) *Green Business: The Five Elements of an Environmentally Responsible Company*. Schiffer Books

This textbook presents a 5-part model for incorporating 'greener thinking' into an organisation. The text also explains why businesses are becoming environmentally friendly, and uses case studies to highlight the benefits of this.

Webster, K. (1999) *Environmental Management in the Hospitality Industry: A Guide for Students and Managers*. Thomson Learning

Aimed at both students and industry managers, this text provides an informative examination of issues related to environmental management in the hospitality industry. The text is agreeably structured into three parts: Challenges to the Earth's Ecosystem (including background issues in environmental management), The Hospitality Industry (including sections on energy, water, waste, green technology, packaging and transport) and The Business Environment (which includes sections on environmental business tools and the environmental audit). The text is easy to read and explains the issues of concern in the environment, such as global warming, very clearly and concisely.

Whitelaw, K. (2004) *ISO 14001 Environmental Management Systems Handbook*. 2nd ed. Butterworth-Heinemann

This is a practical guide for the implementation of the ISO 14001 environmental management system, which includes information on the required standards, guidance on implementation and details of the assessment process.

ANNOTATED GUIDE TO JOURNALS

There are now quite a number of papers emerging on environmental management in general, and those focusing on the hospitality industry. As the following section includes reference to journals on the subject, only a small number of relevant papers are cited here.

Bohdanowicz, P. (2005) European hoteliers' environmental attitudes. Greening the business. *Cornell Hotel and Restaurant Quarterly*, 46(2), pp.188-204

A very interesting research paper which presents the findings of a survey of over 600 representatives of European hotels.

Kirk, D. (1995) Environmental management in hotels. *International Journal of Contemporary Hospitality Management*, 7(6), pp.3-8

This article presents an account of the way in which the hospitality industry has responded to environmental concerns. Now a little out of date, but the paper provides some excellent background information on the principles of environmental management, global and national policies, and guidelines on introducing an environmental management system.

Tzschentke, N., Kirk, D. & Lynch, P. A. (2004) Reasons for going green in serviced accommodation establishments. *International Journal of Contemporary Hospitality Management*, 16(2), pp.116-124.

This paper presents the findings of an exploration into the motivations of serviced accommodation managers in Scotland for their involvement in environmental management practices and participation in an environmental accreditation scheme. The paper includes discussion on the perceived benefits and draw-backs of going 'green'.

Corporate Social Responsibility and Environmental Management (John Wiley & Sons Ltd and ERP Environment)

This journal publishes papers on social and environmental responsibilities in the context of sustainable development. Papers are based upon the results of research relating to the development of tools and techniques for improving performance, case studies of best practice and the assessment of different approaches to social responsibility and environmental management.
